

Moonlight Tournament Rules

1. £5 fee for the tournament and floodlights, for four doubles matches is payable once your name appears on the moonlight fixture list so please give or send to Ken Lake or John Smith as soon as possible. In cases of injury or similar circumstances a player may be refunded part or all of the fee.
2. Designated **Organisers** names are in **Bold** letters. However, please do not rely entirely on the designated **Organiser** and provide help by offering assistance. All matches are to be played under floodlights.
3. This tournament closes when the clocks are changed to British Summer Time in the spring. So please aim to play at least one match every month on average and at least two before the 31 December, otherwise this may count against you in the final analysis. Experience tells us that organising matches can become increasingly difficult, due to having to work around injury and/or family commitments with fewer opportunities as BST approaches.
4. However, if you know that you will not be able to complete all your matches (for whatever reason), please tell Ken who may be able to arrange a substitute for you. This will be of great help to all those who were to play with/against you.
5. **Organisers**, please book an available court on the calendar in the Clubhouse for any evening remembering that there is coaching on Monday night, Wednesday is ladies teams' practice night and Thursday is club night. In all cases two courts will probably be in use.
6. Matches are to be best of 3 sets with tie-breakers, if required. Please agree with your opponents before you start, how you will play the 3rd set (normal set with tie break at 6 all or championship tie –break ie first to 10 points with two clear. Please record the result on the table pinned up on the notice board and also notify Rob Whistlecroft so that the website can be updated.
7. The tournament winners – a lady and a gentleman – will be those winning the most matches (but in the case of a tie, then the least number of sets or games conceded will determine the winner).
